## Lesson Procedure

Teacher does (I Do):

Teacher has students look at cover of the novel and tells them that this character is a boy that had to leave his country to move to the United States. "Why do some people have to leave their country?"

Discuss with students the difference between refugee and international students. (Some EAL teachers may have refugees in their group so it is important to be aware of this and sensitive.)

Explore GoogleEarth together to look at Sudan and other refugee camps.

Guide students to find one fact, one video about refugee camps, and one link).
