Do they feel that they miss a lot?</li> <li>Explain to students that listening is a skill that requires practice and they can do this by watching movie trailers. Today we are going to do some listening activities with movie trailers.</li> <li>Play the movie trailer (The Perks of Being a Wallflower) without letting the students see it. Was it more difficult to understand? Play again with them being allowed to watch it while listening. Why is this easier?</li> <li>Why is it difficult to understand the speaking in movies?
